Greetings,

As we transition from Spring to Summer, we have much to celebrate as we move forward towards the warmer weather with a flurry of activities. Since our last update, Project Sunshine and our Family Support Department held an amazing Flapjack Breakfast. Our Middleboro Day Habilitation team held an incredible Spring Auction Dance. Our New Bedford Golf Tournament brought both sunshine and an amazing day of fun towards supporting advocacy. My sincere thanks to all of the staff and volunteers who worked above and beyond towards making these events fun and enjoyable- today, more than ever we count on philanthropy to fund critical needs. We are now gearing up for our Arc Strong- Achieving Dreams 5k Walk, Run, & Roll on July 14th. Our website registration has been launched and I hope that you will join some of our team captains in making this year's event a huge success.

In March, we had our Council on Accreditation of Rehabilitation Facilities (CARF) review. As part of accreditation, CARF sends surveyors out every three years and they conduct a comprehensive review of our services. The CARF accreditation process starts with

a provider's commitment to continuous improvement and culminates with external review and recognition that the provider's business and service practices meet international standards of quality -- with all the steps in between focused on optimal outcomes for the persons the provider serves and sustained organizational success. I am delighted to share that we achieved a full three year renewal! These are a few of their comments that they shared:

As we continue to work on infrastructure, our operations team have been working to providing building updates at many locations. Over the past month, our Park Street renovations have included a relocation of family support to the lower level and they are finalizing the upper level to expand our day program expansion needs. They are also finalizing renovations at our Taunton, Middleboro, and Smithfield

locations towards improving our services. We are also looking to make improvements in training, technology, innovation and communication.

As this is budget season, I am pleased to announce that we have made significant progress in both Massachusetts and Rhode Island as we have worked diligently with our partners to increase awareness for the workforce campaigns to raise the direct support salaries across the agency. We have received positive news from our respective state leadership that they will be releasing critical investments in the coming year. Employment First

James receives services at our proAbility location. He was recently hired at Walco, in Providence RI, a diversified high-technology company that specializes in the optimization of rotating electro-mechanical apparatus and automated process equipment. It is the largest transit motor rebuilding facility in New England.

James works in the transportation/ locomotive group that specialize in rebuilding, rewinding and remanufacturing of AC and DC traction motors, generators, and auxiliary equipment. He works 20 hours a week, and takes the bus to and from work. His job responsibilities include generator part preparation such as sandblasting, coil assembly, polishing, and painting. He relies on his natural supports at work.

The great thing about this story is not only James getting employment, but how the power of networking

made this happen! A staff member here at proAbility had an inside connection at Walco that knew they were looking for help. We scheduled a meet and greet, and we took three people who receive services from us on a Walco tour. It was not a good fit for two of them, but it was for James. He was offered the position the same day, and started working the following week.

Ginny treats Rachel as if she were a family member. Ginny has provided many positive changes in Rachel's life. Under Ginny's care Rachel has overcome physical and emotional challenges and due to Ginny's consistent love and support Rachel is now flourishing. Of course things aren't always easy and there are challenges that remain but Ginny faces these challenges with a commitment to Rachel's best interest in mind. Ginny is committed, kind and patient and most people who know Ginny and Rachel would say there is no person that Rachel feels more comfortable around than

Ginny. When it comes to being a caregiver, Ginny is attentive to Rachel's needs and always seeks information to improve supports and services Rachel receives. She works collaboratively and diligently with all team members involved in Rachel's life including Rachel's sister, the medical professionals, the day program, The Arc's AFC Team and the Department of Developmental Services. Ginny works diligently to ensure that she regularly and repeatedly connects with all team members to ensure the best quality of life for Rachel. For example, it was recently suggested by a team member that Rachel begin to use a wheelchair to prevent falls but Ginny knows that using a wheelchair could make Rachel more dependent on using one full time. Ginny doesn't



want Rachel to regress or inhibit her independence so she suggested that Rachel's team ensure stand by assistance when Rachel ambulates to prevent falls. Ginny's focus is always on Rachel's best interest and it is clear Ginny wants Rachel to thrive!


